
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Pattern for Little Dilly Bag (Pattern no. BEG005)

Diagram 1: Pattern chart



Bag

Foundation Chain:	20ch
Row 1:	4 ch, tr into 6 th ch from hook, 19 tr, turn
Row 2:	2 ch, 20 hdc, turn
Row 3-22:	alternate between Row 1 (tr) and Row 2 (hdc)

To create stripes do a row of tr + a row of hdc in one color, then do the next 2 rows (a row of tr + a row of hdc) in the second color. For help with color changes see our Learn to Crochet section on www.dkodesigns.com

Shoulder strap

Foundation ch: 120 ch


Row 1: 2 ch, 120 hdc

Assemble as per following diagram.


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Diagram 2: Assembling the bag


1. Place rectangle wrong side up.



2. Fold Row 1 - 8 up from the bottom and sew sides in place.



3. Fold Row 21 -22 down to over Row 8.



4. Attach button to the middle of Row 1, then use Row 21 (tr row) as a button hole so the button does up at the front.



5. Sew shoulder strap ends to bag on the back of Row 1 inside each top corner.
